The Spiritual Works of Mercy are: •To instruct the ignorant-Are you old enough to volunteer with your parish's religious education program or Vacation Bible School contact them and find out. Does your library need volunteers to help with their programs? If not, see if there is a family who could use a mother's helper and use that time to play games or read books with younger children. •To counsel the doubtful-Is there someone in your family or parish who could use a letter of encouragement and love? Send a spiritual bouquet along with some Scripture verse assuring them of God's everlasting love and mercy. •To admonish sinners-Begin a rosary campaign for the Pope's monthly intentions. Either on your own or with your family or group begin to support his role as shepherd of the Church. These next two are works of personal formation and self-control. Talk to your parents about how you can display them in your family and school life especially with younger siblings: •To bear wrongs patiently-Speak kindly and softly to those who wrong you, seek to understand the mistakes and not see them as personal attacks. •To forgive willingly-Be ready with "I forgive you" when people offend or hurt you (even if they don't say they're sorry) •To comfort the afflicted-Reach out to children at school, homeschool groups or gatherings who are sad. Stand up for those who are being bullied. Remember that for evil to succeed, it only takes that the good do nothing.
